The Community Based Care Transitions Program (CCTP), mandated by section 3026 of the Affordable Care Act, provides funding to test models for improving care transitions for high-risk Medicare beneficiaries.

Masspro will provide technical assistance to health care organizations applying to CCTP or other formal care transitions programs. Available assistance includes the following:

- Root cause analysis to identify community-specific causes for poor transitions
- Alignment with community partners
- Identification of target population within a geographically defined community
- Selection of evidence-based interventions aimed at identified drivers of poor transitions in the targeted population
- Access to data analysis and trending

Upon acceptance into the CCTP or another formal transitions program, organizations will be able to participate in Masspro-sponsored webinars, list-serve discussions, information sharing, and teleconferences.

If your organization is not accepted into CCTP or another formal transitions program, you may continue to work with Masspro as part of a community team in its Initiative for Improving Transitions of Care.

Benefits of continued collaboration with Masspro include the ability to develop and test your community transitions model, participation in Learning and Action Networks with webinars, list-serve discussions and information sharing, teleconferences, invitations to CMS national meetings, and access to quarterly data and trending.
